Job title: Project Manager – Our Heron, Our Future

Main purpose of job: To lead the delivery of Our Heron, Our Future, a National Lottery-funded Community Power programme supporting residents of Heron Ward in Herne Bay, to influence the services they use and decisions that affect their lives. The postholder will balance hands-on community delivery with project management responsibilities, including monitoring, reporting, learning capture and partnership coordination.

Main duties

1. Project Delivery & Community Engagement

- Lead day-to-day delivery of the Community Power programme.
- Build trusted relationships with residents, groups, community leaders and partners.
- Coordinate and deliver community engagement activities including events, outreach and participatory workshops.
- Support the recruitment and training of Community Participatory Researchers.
- Facilitate the Community Advisory Group and ensure lived experience shapes the programme.
- Support delivery of micro-grant funded small projects.
- Help residents co-design solutions to identified priority issues.

2. Programme Management

- Maintain a detailed delivery plan and oversee project progress.
- Manage the project budget in line with grant conditions.
- Coordinate partnership meetings and maintain clear communication across agencies.
- Maintain risk logs, project documentation and compliance records.

3. Monitoring, Evaluation & Reporting

- Lead monitoring and data collection, ensuring accurate engagement data and insight capture.
- Maintain the Insight Bank and ensure data is handled securely (UK GDPR compliant).
- Produce monthly reports for partners, governance boards and The National Lottery Community Fund.
- Capture and synthesise learning for local and national Community Power learning programmes.

4. Partnership Working & System Change

- Build effective relationships with statutory agencies, VCSE organisations and the Heron Neighbourhood Team.
- Support partners to work in a "doing with, not to" way, reflecting on power-sharing and co-production.
- Coordinate attendance at national learning events.
- Share insights and emergent themes across the partnership.

5. Communications & Representation

- Promote the project locally using appropriate National Lottery branding.
- Prepare updates, case studies and stories for internal and external communications.
- Represent the project at community forums and partner meetings.
